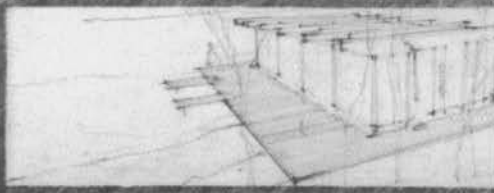
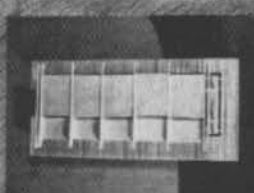
Born of unique culture and landscape a traveller delivers the spirit of a new architecture rooted and nurtured by Finnish soil, simultaneously migrating

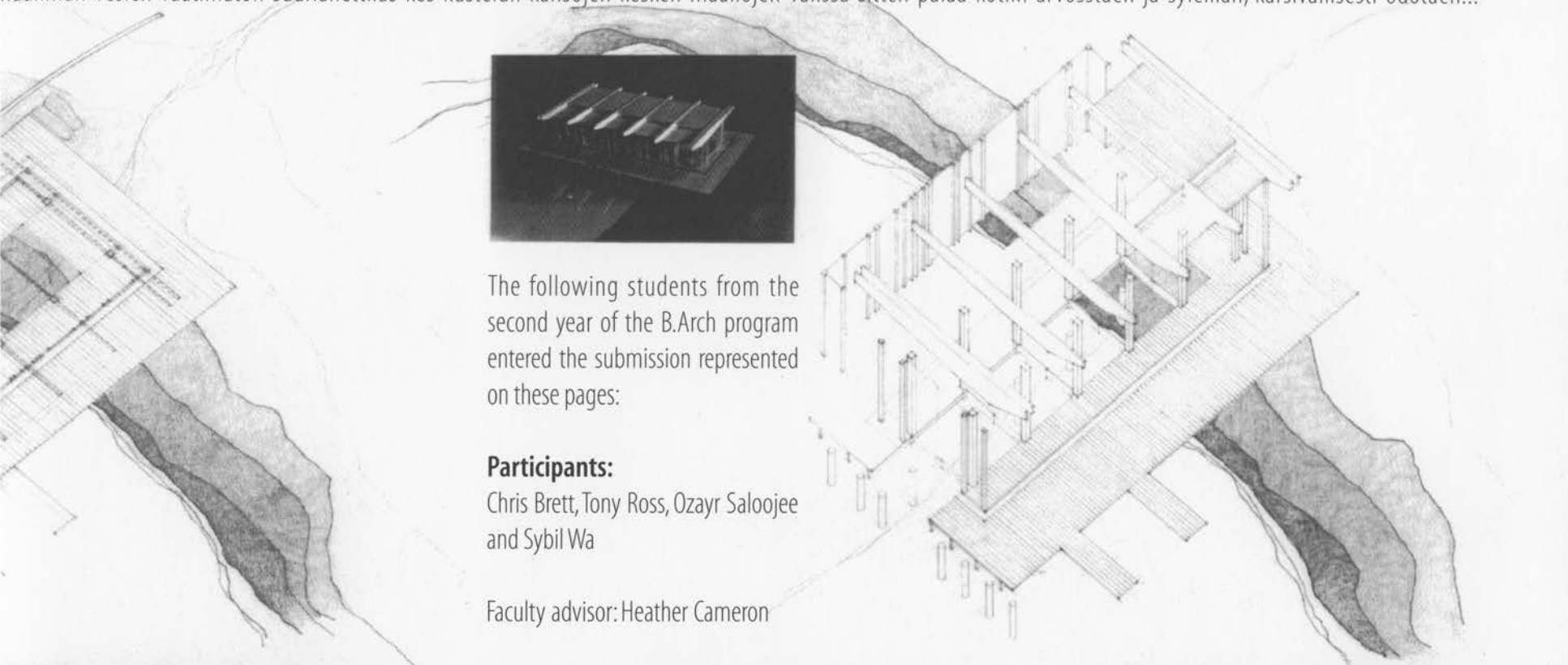
